Chapter 1

Profile overview

About

Yucatan is a state located in the southeast of Mexico, given its location and geographical characteristics we have a unique biodiversity. In Yucatan we have a unique natural wealth, to mention that we are home to 55% of the total extension of mangrove coverage of Mexico. These ecosystems are among the most productive worldwide, providing numerous services such as protection against natural disasters and their capacity to store carbon is three times greater than the terrestrial forests. Likewise, in Yucatan there has been decreed 16 natural protected areas, it has 535,246 ha of state natural protected areas, which is equivalent to 13% of its land territory as ecosystem protection. It also has 3,094,623 ha of forest mosaic, which makes it one of the states with the greatest forest coverage in the country and the third largest mangrove area with 96,873 hectares, equivalent to approximately 10.37% of the total mangrove area in the country. It hosts around 478 birds, 124 mammals and 101 reptiles species with one the biggest percentage of endemism in the country. In Yucatan, it is estimated that there are at least 8,000 cenotes, although only 3,002 between cenotes and caves have been registered; and only 31% are suitable for ecotourism use. The Cenotes Ring is an area catalogued as a State Reserve that includes 53 of 106 state's municipalities. The volume of water extracted for different uses in the cenotes ring corresponds to 42% of the volume used in Yucatan and 19% of the total in the peninsula. The state's coastline has an extension of 378 km which is dominated by mangrove wetland ecosystems and the coastal lagoon system that hosts a great biological diversity, and which act as natural nurseries for aquatic species of commercial and ecological importance, in addition to its 535 thousand hectares of protected natural areas.

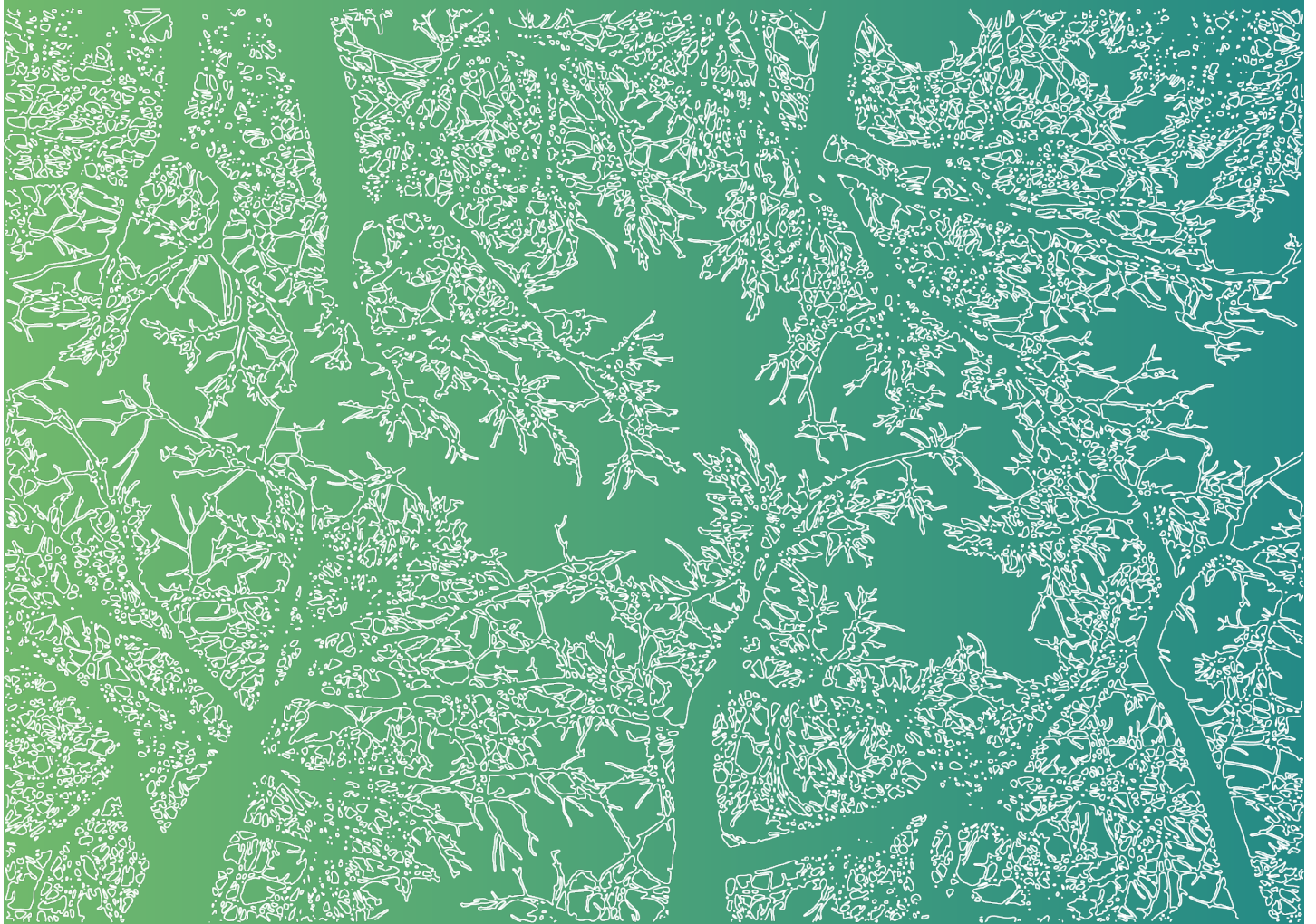
